The BeyondTrust Web Representative Console is a web application that allows the user to view and control a remote device in order to provide customer support; it also has chat functionality for communicating with the remote user.

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Evaluation Methods Used

Assistive technology products used as part of testing included Freedom Scientific JAWS 2021, NVDA 2020.4, Freedom Scientific ZoomText 2020, The Paciello Group's Colour Contrast Analyser 2.5, Microsoft Windows accessibility features, and keyboard-only control. Testing was performed with this assistive technology on Chrome and Firefox on Windows 10.
