The executable version of the Management Console installation package includes prerequisites marked with *, and will automatically install them as necessary. A link has been provided for the Microsoft SQL Server 2008 R2 Native Client.

sudo sh /usr/local/libexec/Avecto/Defendpoint/1.0/uninstall.sh
```
